

In the five years between 2001 and 2006 the overall Maryland population increased

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by 4.3%, while the Maryland Hispanic population increased by 42.8%.


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
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than Whites to be without health insurance






Hispanics in Maryland are more likely than Whites to

Hispanics in Maryland are more likely than Whites to have been diagnosed with diabetes at ages 45-64




Hispanic Women in Maryland are more likely than Non Hispanic


