



**CONSENT AGREEMENT**

**Background**



On June 30, 2002, Mr. Peterson's license to practice pharmacy expired. Although Mr. Peterson failed to submit a renewal application to the Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), he continued to practice pharmacy until October 28, 2002, without a license. On October 31, 2002, the Board received a reinstatement application from Mr. Peterson. The reinstatement application indicated that Mr. Peterson had completed the necessary continuing education ("CE") hours during the 2000-2002 license term. The Board subsequently decided to enter into this Consent Agreement in lieu of filing formal charges against Mr. Peterson for the unauthorized practice of pharmacy.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Mr. Peterson last renewed his license to practice pharmacy on May 31, 2000. Mr. Peterson's license expired on June 30, 2002.
2. Mr. Peterson failed to submit a completed renewal application to the Board.
3. Although his license expired on June 30, 2002, Mr. Peterson continued to practice pharmacy without a license until October 28, 2002.
4. Mr. Peterson submitted a reinstatement application to the Board on October 31, 2002. The reinstatement application evidenced that Mr. Peterson completed the required 30 CE hours during the 2000-2002 license term.
5. The Board reinstated Mr. Peterson's license to practice pharmacy on November 6, 2002.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Mr. Peterson engaged in the unauthorized practice of pharmacy from July 1, 2002, to October 28, 2002, in violation of Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §12-701.

**ORDER**

Based on agreement of the parties, it is this 18th day of June, 2003, by an affirmative vote of a quorum of the Board, hereby,

**ORDERED** that Mr. Peterson shall pay a fine of \$1,000.00; and be it further,

**ORDERED** that this is a final order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, State Government Article, Section 10-617(h).


