## Performing CLIA Waived Tests in Maryland

To conduct CLIA-waived tests in Maryland, a laboratory must have a CMS CLIA Certificate of Waiver and either a <u>Maryland Laboratory Permit</u> or a Letter of Exception. All laboratories must follow the same CLIA-waived test requirements, including the requirement to follow the manufacturer's instructions for performing the test.

To add a new CLIA waived test to a Maryland Laboratory Permit or a Letter of Exception, the laboratory must complete a Change Form: https://health.maryland.gov/ohcg/Labs/docs/LabsApps/Change\_Form\_e.pdf.

CLIA waived tests on the Excepted list are on Schedule B of the Change Form. If a CLIAwaived test is not on the Excepted Test list, the applicant selects the test discipline under Schedule A. If help is needed with test selection please call 410-402-8025. <u>OHCQ</u> processes the request in 1 - 2 days.

The procedure to recommend the addition of new tests to the Excepted Test list, by review of the Laboratory Advisory Committee is in <u>COMAR 10.10.02.01(E)</u>.
