2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19): Temporary Non-Enforcement of Medical Assistance Pharmacy Preauthorization Requirements

On April 6, 2020, the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) issued guidance related to non-enforcement of preauthorization requirements during the state of emergency for antibiotic liquids, enteral nutritional products, and non-preferred drugs, for the Maryland Medicaid Fee-for Service (FFS) Program (see COVID-19 - #13 - Temporary Non-Enforcement of Medical Assistance Pharmacy Preauthorization Requirements).

The guidance also clarifies the changes that the Program is making to the policy for the 72-hour supply of a prescribed drug in emergency situations as follows:

During the state of emergency, the Maryland Medicaid FFS Program will permit prescribed drugs dispensed in an emergency to be filled with up to a 14-day supply, if the prescriber is not able to obtain the necessary preauthorization due to the COVID-19 situation. Maryland Medicaid will not enforce the 72-hour supply limitation for prescribed drugs filled during an emergency. This policy will not apply to controlled dangerous substances or high cost drugs, which will continue to be limited to a 72- hour supply.
