ORDER LIFTING SUSPENSION

On October 26, 2018, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) issued an Order of Suspension of License for Delinquent Child Support (“Order of Suspension”) against Ephraim Nwoko, Pharmacist, License No. 18604 (the “Respondent”). The Board suspended the Respondent’s license to practice pharmacy in Maryland due to his delinquent child support payments upon a request from the Prince George’s County Office of the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Maryland Department of Human Resources (the “Administration”), pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Fam. Law § 10-119.3(e)(2)(i).

On or about September 23, 2019, the Board received a Notice to Reinstate the Respondent’s license from the Administration. However, the Respondent’s license expired on April 30, 2019; as such, the Board cannot reinstate his license unless the Respondent complies with the requirements for reinstatement provided in COMAR 10.34.13.

Therefore, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Fam. Law § 10-119.3(k), on this 1 day of October, 2019, by the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the suspension of the license to practice pharmacy in Maryland held by Ephraim Nwoko, License No. 18604, is **LIFTED**; and it is further,

ORDERED that upon receipt of a reinstatement application, the Board will reinstate the license to practice pharmacy in Maryland held by Ephraim Nwoko, License No. 18604, provided he is otherwise eligible for reinstatement as set forth in COMAR 10.34.13; and it is further,

ORDERED that this is a Final Order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and, as such, is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Provisions §4-333(b).
