PRE-CHARGE CONSENT ORDER FOR REINSTATEMENT

BACKGROUND

On or about April 13, 2023, the Maryland State Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) received an application for reinstatement of a pharmacy technician registration from Alexis Capriles. The Board’s review of the application and its inspection reports of the pharmacy in which Mr. Capriles worked indicated that he had been working as a pharmacy technician without a registration and had submitted false information to the Board on his application for reinstatement.

In lieu of instituting formal proceedings against Mr. Capriles’ application in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-01 *et seq.*, the Board held a Pre-Charge Case Resolution Conference to determine whether this matter could be resolved without the need for formal proceedings. As a result, the Board and Mr. Capriles have agreed to resolve this matter in accordance with the terms set forth in this Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about March 28, 2023, the Board conducted an annual inspection of the pharmacy (“Pharmacy A”) for which Mr. Capriles worked on staff as a pharmacy

technician.

2. During the inspection, the Board's inspector noted that Mr. Capriles' pharmacy technician registration had expired on March 31, 2021, approximately two (2) years prior.
3. During the inspection, the Board's inspector noted Mr. Capriles' initials as the data entry technician on prescription labels for dispensed controlled dangerous substances drugs.
4. Subsequently, on April 13, 2023, the Board received a reinstatement application from Mr. Capriles for reinstatement of his expired technician registration.
5. On the application, Mr. Capriles answered "no" to Question #11 which asks whether he had worked as a pharmacy technician on his expired registration.
6. Mr. Capriles indicates that personal circumstances caused him to inadvertently allow his registration to lapse for the extended period. He states that he also worked as a delivery driver for the pharmacy after the expiration of his registration.
7. Mr. Capriles further asserts that he mistakenly answered Question #11 incorrectly on his application but admits that his answer was false.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that Mr. Capriles is subject to discipline pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 12-6B-01, 12-6B-09(2), and 12-6B-13.

ORDER

Based on an affirmative vote of the Board, it is this 19th day of March, 2023,²⁴

hereby:

ORDERED that Mr. Capriles' pharmacy technician registration be REINSTATED; and be it further,


ORDERED that Mr. Capriles shall pay a civil fine in the amount of \$250 in accordance with COMAR 10.34.11.09B, payment of which is stayed due to Mr. Capriles' personal circumstances; and be it further,

ORDERED that, within thirty (30) days, Mr. Capriles shall draft and submit an anonymous article for possible publication in the Board's newsletter regarding the importance of timely renewal of a professional license/registration and potential consequences for failure to do so; and be it further,

ORDERED that in the event Mr. Capriles fails to fully comply with the terms and conditions of this Order, the Board may pursue further disciplinary action against his registration, to include suspension or revocation, after Mr. Capriles is provided notice and an opportunity for a hearing; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland State Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Md. Code Ann., Gen. Provisions § 4-333(b).



CONSENT


1. By signing this Consent, I hereby affirm the findings of fact contained herein and agree to be bound by the foregoing Consent Order and its conditions.

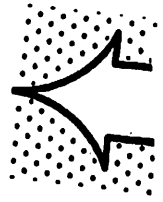
