CONSENT ORDER

Background

On or about May 21, 2012, Erica Moran submitted a pharmacy technician registration renewal application to the Maryland State Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), in accordance with Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-07(c). On her renewal application, Ms. Moran answered "yes" to the question "Have you pled guilty, nolo contendere, or been convicted of, or received probation before judgment of driving while intoxicated or a controlled dangerous substances offense?" Ms. Moran admitted to having received probation before judgment for driving under the influence of alcohol during the renewal period

In lieu of instituting formal proceedings against Ms. Moran's registration, in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-01 et seq., the Board has offered Ms. Moran the opportunity to resolve this matter by agreeing to the terms set forth in this Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Ms. Moran was initially registered as a pharmacy technician on August 25, 2008.
- 2. On or about May 21, 2012, Ms. Moran applied for renewal of her pharmacy technician registration.
- 3. On her renewal application, Ms. Moran answered "yes" to the question "Have you pled guilty, nolo contendere, or been convicted of, or received probation before judgment of driving while intoxicated or a controlled dangerous substances offense?" She attached to her renewal application an explanation that she received probation before judgment for driving under the influence of alcohol in December, 2010.
- 4. Ms. Moran is currently on unsupervised probation for this offense.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that Ms. Moran is subject to discipline pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-09(22).

ORDER

Based on an affirmative vote of the Board, it is this 19th day of July, 2012, hereby:

ORDERED that upon the next renewal of Ms. Moran's pharmacy technician registration in May 2014, she shall submit to a State criminal history records check; and be it further.

ORDERED that in the event Ms. Moran's criminal history records check indicates further criminal activity, the Board may impose further disciplinary action against her registration, including suspension or revocation, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing; and be it further,

ORDERED that Ms. Moran shall be responsible for all costs associated with this Consent Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Md. Code Ann., State Gov't § 10-617(h).
