ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") is in receipt of a petition from Chukwuemeka Steve Frank Obidike, License No. 16011, requesting modification of certain terms of probation as set forth in the Board's Order Lifting Suspension, dated September 21, 2011. The Order Lifting Suspension placed Mr. Obidike's license on probation for a period of five (5) years based on prior convictions for obtaining controlled substances by fraud. Specifically, Mr. Obidike requests modifying his probationary conditions to allow him to work night shifts and/or work as a floater or for a staffing agency. Upon consideration of Mr. Obidike's petition, the Board voted to modify the term of probation relating to working night shifts, as ordered below.

It is this 29 day of 5 hr., 2013, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

ORDERED that Order Lifting Suspension, dated September 21, 2011, be modified to allow Mr. Obidike to work night shifts, provided that:

- a. Mr. Obidike practices under the direct onsite supervision of a licensed pharmacist during the shift; and
- b. Mr. Obidike obtains prior Board approval of the place of employment; and be it further

ORDERED that all other terms of the September 21, 2011, Order Lifting Suspension remain in full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, State Government Article, Section 10-617(h).
