- Overdose Deaths on the rise
 - 63,600 U.S. drug overdose deaths in 2016
- 70% of the 14.8 million misusing drugs are employed
 - 21% of workers reported being injured or put in danger, or needing to work harder due to others drinking
 - Drug using employees take 3 times as many sick benefits




- Hospitality workers are among the top occupations with the highest rates of illicit drug use



The Addiction in the Workplace pre & post evaluations responses were insightful

- Businesses are aware of the problem of substance use in the workplace
- Most are <u>unaware</u> of community resources that provide help
- Interested in Narcan training and Mental Health First Aid training on site
- Knowledge of community recourses available increased in 90% of post surveys completed
